Tomorrow, Tuesday, May 2, voters in the Northridge School District will have the opportunity to renew an Operating Levy. This Operating levy was first passed in 2009 and is designed to be renewed every five years. While it is referred to as an "Emergency Levy," there is not an emergency at this time; however, maintaining current funding is critical to being able to support our current instructional programs. An Emergency levy is for a specific period of time, in this case, five years, and is designed to be renewed, as opposed to a standard operating levy that is for a continuing period of time. This renewal will provide the district with \$2.1 million a year; this is a fixed amount and will not increase. Homeowners are currently paying this tax; therefore, it is not a new tax. If the tax were to be renewed, it would be for a period of five years. The operating renewal is used for day-to-day operations, including teacher salaries, instructional materials, and technology.
